4-Hour Event Theme: Improving Police-Community Relations & Public Safety

Sample 4-hour agenda with Dinner Option (adjust times for Breakfast or Lunch options)

3 pm - Staff arrives to begin setting up room and conduct audio/visual checks.

3:30 - 4:30 pm - Volunteers and Young Leaders arrive and are briefed on their assignments. Continue prep and setup.

4:30 pm - Doors open and registration begins. Casual networking reception with light refreshments.

5:15 - 6:00 pm - OFFICIAL START TIME. Dinner is served and registration continues.

5:40 - 5:55 pm - Brief casual remarks from various community leaders during dinner, setting tone for a collaborative, Aloha-filled, solutions-oriented evening.

6:00 - 6:05 pm - Official Welcome from Event Host. Thank you to guests and sponsors for participating. Advisory regarding traumatic scenes in the film and let viewers know that counselors are on-hand. The film is not officially rated, but is equivalent to a PG-13 rating.

6:05 - 7:35 pm - Film Screening

7:35 - 7:40 pm - Introduction of Filmmaker and/or Cast Member(s) by Moderator

7:40 - 7:55 pm - Moderator leads Q&A with Filmmaker and/or Cast Member(s). 3x5 cards on tables are collected by Assistants who hand them to moderator, who then selects a few questions from the audience to be answered by the Filmmaker and/or Cast Member(s).

7:55 - 8 pm - Moderator gives instructions for Small Group Discussions (participants stay seated at same tables).

8 - 8:05 - BREAK. Aloha Breathing Exercise before returning from break.

8:05 - 8:35 pm - Guided Small Group Discussions led by young adults and teens. The questions are designed very specifically to guide people through their emotions into a space of "how can I/we become part of the solution?" and spark positive, solutions-oriented individual and group action steps.

1. *Describe how the film made you feel on a personal level? (5 minutes)*
2. *Share one thing you learned from the film. (5 minutes)*
3. *How can police use the L.O.V.E. Is The Answer principles to improve police-community relations? (5 minutes)*
4. *How can people other than police use the L.O.V.E. Is The Answer principles to improve police-community relations? (5 minutes)*
5. *What can our organization do to make a difference in our overall community using the L.O.V.E. Is The Answer principles? (5 minutes)*
6. *Moving forward, what will you personally commit to doing to put L.O.V.E. into action in your home, place of work, school, or greater community? (5 minutes)*

8:35 - 8:55 pm - Team leaders report out to the entire room with one lesson learned or a suggested action step to improve police-community relations and public safety (1 minute each x up to 20 groups of 7 at a table, or configure for more time if fewer groups). Suggested action steps are marked on a white board or other display for everyone to see.

8:55 - 9:10 pm - Where Do We Go From Here? Entire group votes to select 3 items that they will act on together moving forward to improve police-community relations and public safety.

9:10 - 9:15 pm - Closing Remarks by Host including invitation to participants to stay in touch and do the work together.

9:15 pm - Event Concludes.
