7:00 AM	Staff arrives to set up the room, conduct audio/visual checks, and prepare to receive guests.
8:30 – 9:30 AM	Doors open and registration begins with casual networking. Breakfast is served. Uplifting activity and level setting. Official Welcome and review agenda and purpose of the event. Suggest engaging in group murals and kintsugi art projects. (two murals and two kintsugi projects available). Traumatic scenes advisory and counselor availability.
9:30 – 11:00 AM	Film Screening
11:00 – 11:15 AM	BREAK. Aloha Breathing Exercise.
11:15 – 11:30 AM	Introduction of Filmmaker and/or Cast Member(s) by Moderator. Moderator leads Q&A with Filmmaker and/or Cast Member(s). 3x5 cards on tables are collected by Assistants who hand them to moderator, who then selects a few questions from the audience to be answered by the Filmmaker and/or Cast Member(s).
11:30 – 11:35 AM	Moderator gives instructions for Small Group Discussions.
11:35 – 12:05 PM	Guided Small Group Discussions led by young adults. The questions are designed very specifically to guide people through their emotions into a space of “how can I/we become part of the solution?” and spark positive, solutions-oriented individual and group action steps. 1. Describe how the film made you feel on a personal level? (5 minutes) 2. Share one thing you learned from the film. (5 minutes). 3. How can police use the L.O.V.E. Is The Answer principles to improve police-community relations and public safety? (5 minutes) 4. How can people other than police use the L.O.V.E. Is The Answer principles to improve police-community relations and public safety? (5 minutes) 5. What can our organization do to make a difference in our overall community using the L.O.V.E. Is The Answer principles? (5 minutes) 6. Moving forward, what will you personally commit to doing to put L.O.V.E. into action in your home, place of work, school, or greater community? (5 minutes)



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12:05 – 12:20 PM

Team leaders report out to the entire room in popcorn style (very brief comments, no speeches) with one lesson learned or a suggested action step to improve police-community relations and public safety (45-60 seconds each x up to 20 groups of 7 at a table). Suggested action steps are marked on a white board or other display for everyone to see.

12:20 – 12:45 PM

Entire group votes from the suggested action steps to select 3 items that they will act on together moving forward to improve police-community relations and public safety.

12:45 – 1:15 PM

LUNCH & PREP FOR SECOND HALF: During the first 15 minutes, everyone casts votes for 3 issues they want to tackle in their community. During the last 15 minutes, young leaders tally the votes and select the top 3 issues voted for that we will cover in the afternoon.

1:15 – 1:45 PM

Team Building exercise – Step Inside the Circle

1:45 – 3:15 PM

Breakout groups discuss L.O.V.E.-based solutioning for the 3 police-community relations/public safety action steps and the 3 other community issue action steps – and prepare presentations to share with the overall group. **HANDS ON - HIGH ENERGY - FUN - CREATIVE**

3:15 – 4:00 PM

20 Small groups give 2-minute presentations to the larger group.

4:00 – 4:50 PM

Where Do We Go From Here? Final discussions and voting on action steps for the group to take to solve for the 3 public safety and 3 other community issues in the coming months and years. Vote for leaders. Give awards and certificates. Discuss follow-up plans for staying engaged, setting goals, accomplishing goals, etc.

4:50 – 5:00 PM

Closing comments and summit ends – but the journey begins!
